Unity is paramount in the church of the living God; it is vital to the health and strength of the church

The enemy is constantly attacking the unity of the body of Christ because he knows that without unity the work of the Lord is hindered; without unity it is impossible to see progress – Nehemiah 4:6

When we look at the world today and see groups such as the homosexual liberal movement, it is plain to see that there is unity among the enemy. They will stick together for their “cause” no matter how much they differ personally. It is very often that they do not have the majority, but they have the greatest unity; therefore, their agenda and propaganda are passed!

You can see this marvel all through the scriptures. In Joshua 9:2 all the kings came out to fight against Israel with “one accord” – which means to be of **ONE MIND**.

The murderers of the Martyr Stephen were unified in Acts 7:57, and again in Acts 18:12 with one accord making insurrection against the Apostle Paul. We see a host of people in Acts 19:34 crying out for hours with “**ONE VOICE**” to Diana of the Ephesians.

If our enemy is unified against us, how much more should we unite against our adversary?

Jesus even said that the World LOVES its own in John 15:19 “*If ye were of the world, **the world would love his own**: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you.*”

Can we say the same thing about the church?

I was talking with a convert who has not been in church for very long, and he said something that broke my heart. He said that when you are out in the world you always have your guard up. You know to put up that wall because you are expecting to get hurt by people. However, when he got saved and joined the family of God, he lowered all of his walls because he thought he was in a

safe and secure place among friends only to find that it is possible to be wounded in the house of the brethren.

Many have been damaged by friendly fire. We can all think of casualties who have fallen to the pain of two words that should never go together but very often do – CHURCH TROUBLE.

Paul deals with this in his first chapter of his first letter to the Corinthian church – “Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. For it hath been declared unto me of you, my brethren...that there are contentions among you.” – *Contentions* literally means “heated disagreements”.

It takes a church family working together to promote a unified atmosphere in the church so that when sinners come in they feel the Love of God and the Spirit of Christ working in the body of believers.

Studies have found that honeybees work together in a tremendously unified way. They selflessly work one with another having all things common, living closely together in the hive without any strife. When temperatures get heated in the hive they will all with one accord flap their wings in perfect unison to cool off the atmosphere of the hive. They do this to keep the honeycombs from melting, and to prevent the fruit of their labors from wasting away in the heat of the moment.

I believe there is a lesson to be learned here for all of us. When disagreements arise in the church of the living God and things get a little “heated”, let us work together to create an atmosphere of unity so that we can preserve this precious gift of abundant life that has been given to us to share one with another.

What remains for our children and grandchildren

Are you as mystified by the state of our government and by the quality of people that offer themselves as candidates for our highest offices as I am? Really, I used to get involved in conversations about politics and would be passionate for a candidate, but I find myself dismayed at our choices and wishing for God to intervene.

In this race for President, we have been given a wide variety of men and women from which to choose. Probably none are inherently evil in the active sense; maybe a few are evil in the passive sense as they subscribe to views that are diametrically opposed to ours. However, I am cynical about any of their faith. Of course, at this time of the election cycle, they all like to trot out to a few churches and put on a show. Despite their efforts, they are as transparent as glass. Seriously, did you ever know a committed Christian that could keep it in even in conversation about secular topics? It is the word of God especially that leaks from us; it is part of our vernacular. If you consume enough of it, it becomes your worldview, your way of explaining things, and your guidebook for all you do. It is the lens that you see things through. So really, Brothers and Sisters, we have no real Christian candidates as you and I understand it. We are to be ruled by Jeroboam, son of Nebat.

What is the state of a land that has no better choice than this? Could it be that we are getting what we asked for or what we deserve? By being non participatory, by being prayerless, by being lukewarm or cold, by being wicked and murderous, are we getting the leaders we deserve?

All of us are familiar with Romans Chapter 1. It is possible for God to simply turn his back. You know, I have learned as a parent and boss, that sometimes the best teacher is consequences. God might be letting us have some consequences here. Friends, I don't want this piece to be about this candidate or that one, it is not my argument; but, can any of us imagine the state of this land if we get two terms of some of these people that are currently on the ballot (or any of them, for that matter)? Currently, there is one vacancy on the Supreme Court and my math says the average age of the remaining Justices is 68 yrs. If you take the youngest out of the equation, the average age of the remaining seven Justices is 71. There are three in their late 70's or early 80's. One is almost 83. Add eight years to any of that and you can see the gravity of the situation where these nominees are concerned. This election has consequences.

Further, the first few verses of Romans 13 states that God ordains the power on this earth, and my research indicates that God refers to evil or Gentile rulers in several Old Testament chapters in terms such as "Shepherd" and "Hammer" (see Isaiah 44 and Jeremiah 51, respectively). Without getting too deep into the discussion of God's sovereignty vs. mans responsibility, I think it is safe to say that God expects us to respect the government that is placed over us and also clearly uses nations and rulers to afflict. Finally, throughout the lineage of the Kings of early Israel, we see where many of the leaders "followed after the ways of Jeroboam, Son of Nebat". God sent prophets to rebuke, but seemed to allow the people of Israel to enjoy the consequences of their actions.

I know, I know.... It is all in God's hands. I believe that, too. However, as fond as we are of saying we give the devil too much credit, we also don't take enough responsibility for our own actions in the way things go. I once heard a comment that God works in the supernatural and leaves the stuff you can do in the natural to you and me! We had a hand in creating this situation.

The second law of thermodynamics says that there is an increasing state of disorder or entropy in the universe. Roughly translated, that says things are falling apart. Fact is it takes energy and inputs to maintain any system in a highly ordered state. All the way from Noah to a few years ago, man had been building increasingly sophisticated ways to govern themselves and live together. This culminated with the formation of a country and government founded on the principles of Christ by men who were Christians. Our forefather's writings drip with references to the written and living Word. This has slowly degraded to the point that we are about to tip into a season when we no longer lift up the name of Jesus as a people. In fact, His name is an anathema to many of the

folks we live around. I suppose it must fly apart eventually. We don't know for sure, but I suspect that our system may not survive until His second coming and almost certainly will not survive the tribulation.

What remains for our children and grandchildren? Will it be to be faced with being completely marginalized and eventually persecuted openly or to be compromised by the ever lower creeping standards?

It is a sad state of affairs when one has to explain what a transgender person is to a son or daughter and how that is different from a homosexual. It is pathetic to think

that my little granddaughters will someday be forced to share a restroom with a pervert who has decided he is a female despite his X and Y chromosomes that will attest to his maleness as long as he lives. It makes me think of how bad it can get and how we do still have some freedom. We still have freedom to choose wisely and with discernment. It can get worse.....reference Lot's last few hours in Sodom. Most of us have read that account all our lives, almost regarding it as a fairy tale, it seemed so impossible.

NOT ANYMORE! It is a very real possibility that we have nearly degraded that far.

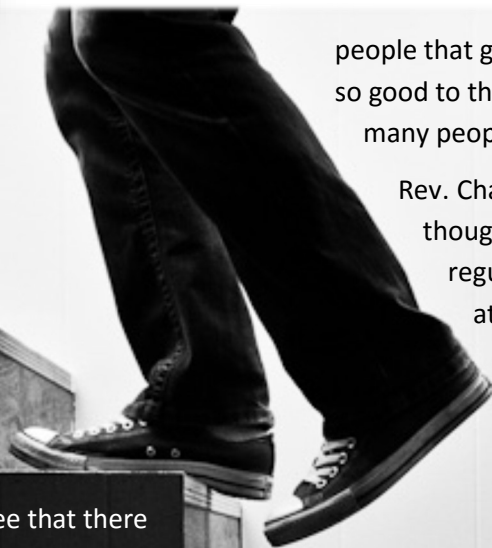
here, to sell out, to pack up, and to move to another place. I have no idea where that may be, but I am sure all of us now understand our forefathers a little more than we did even ten years ago.

**Time to Step Up**

In this verse we can see that there was a work to do, and the great Apostle Paul was asking the fiery young evangelist, Apollos, to come to the work in Corinth. However, Apollos told Paul that he would come when he had convenient time. Basically, he was telling Paul that maybe in his spare time he'd come. Some people are the same way--they want to serve God when they want to serve God; they want to do right when they want to do right; they want to obey when it is convenient for them.

We need people, especially young people, that go to youth rally not because it is convenient for them, but rather because they are committed. We need

people that go to church being faithful to God because God has been so good to them, and He has blessed them and saved their soul. Too many people tell God, "Maybe in my spare time I'll sell out to you."

Rev. Charles Spurgeon tells a story saying, "A Christian tradesman thought about the fact that he had never spoken to a certain regular customer about his soul, though the man had called at his shop for years. He therefore determined to plead earnestly with him the next time he came in, but there was no next time. His customer died suddenly, so that he saw him no more."

God cannot effectively use people that just serve Him in their spare time, but He wants people that are completely sold out to Him. Ephesians 5:16 says, "Redeeming the time because the days are evil." Let us do our best to wisely use the time God has given us for the glory of God.





HOLD YOUR ROPE

Mark 2:4 *“And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken [it] up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay.”*

I cannot truly say that these four men used ropes tied to his bed to let him down through the roof, but it makes sense to me. They used something...so for the sake of this column, let us assume it was ropes.

The Reason

What prompted these four friends to take it upon themselves to carry their friend to Jesus? The reason was he was very sick with palsy. Smith’s Bible Dictionary meaning of palsy is this: The loss of sensation or the power of motion, or both, in any part of the body. Obviously, this man was a paralytic. He was not ambulatory himself.

Brothers and Sisters, we don’t have to look very far to find “THE REASON.” Our communities right around us are full of sin-paralyzing patients that need a Savior! There is a REASON TO HOLD YOUR ROPE!

The Resources

Vs. 3 *“And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four.”*

One of the main excuses for not getting anything done is... *“We don’t have the resources.”* I was always taught to *“use what you have.”* So here are four men that used what they had at that moment to accomplish something great. Also, resources are not only tangible items... you yourself are a resource that God can use. Finally, notice that all four carried the load. It would have been heavier with just three or two, but the weight of the burden was equally distributed. Let’s hold our rope and be the resource that God wants us to be, and be content to use what you already have!

The Risk

Vs. 4, *“they uncovered the roof where he was:”*

This endeavor seems to me to be a relatively small risk. Howbeit, there was still some danger involved in climbing up on the roof with their friend. What if the roof wouldn’t support all their weight? Or what if a rope slipped? I perceive that the closer we get to the coming

of the Lord, there will be greater risks involved in doing His will. But friend, that’s part of Christianity. Hold your rope. It is risky, but it’ll be well worth the risk!

The Redemption

Vs. 5 *“When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee.”*

These four men witnessed firsthand God’s plan of redemption through His Son, Jesus Christ. Can you imagine the joy they experienced that day? Was the risk worth it? Definitely! Would they do it again if needed? Certainly. Can you imagine how that boosted their faith? Hold your rope and see what Christ will do in people’s lives.

The Response

Vs. 12 *“And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion.”*

Do you see what happens when you hold your rope? Not only does redemption come, but REVIVAL comes! Many people are touched when you do your part. But remember...it was all done to GLORIFY GOD! Not you. Not I. Not us collectively, but God. LET US ALL HOLD OUR ROPE!

LABORERS FOR HARVEST

As a missionary to the country of Haiti for almost 18 years, one of my favorite scriptures would be found in Matthew 9:35-38. This is a typical missionary passage that I have preached from many times and have heard preached from many times. Typically it is preached for people to answer the call of God because the needs are great, and there are many souls that we need to reach. For the next few paragraphs I would like to consider different thoughts concerning this passage of Scripture.

The first thought was presented to me by an older evangelist's wife at my home church in Missouri. During prayer request she stood and challenged the church to pray the only prayer request that was recorded as given by Jesus. Matthew 9:38 "Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest." She challenged the church that never once has she heard anybody give the request that Jesus gave - to pray for more laborers. She challenged me that day to pray that prayer daily because, if it was a burden on our Savior's heart, it should be a burden on ours. I have tried to faithfully pray that prayer, and I challenge you to do the same.

The second thought is the need for Laborers. As I have travelled to many different states and have worked extensively in Haiti, the one thing I have seen in the Holiness Churches throughout the world is the need for Laborers. It is not preachers, it isn't musicians and singers, it isn't evangelists, or even missionaries, but as the Lord Jesus was looking out at the multitude of hurting, hungry, and suffering people, He said the need is for LABORERS. Laborers - who wants to be that? In the generation in which we are living, it is hard to find people that want to be a Laborer, everybody in the job market is looking for that easy job with no sweat and tears where they can then go home and have a nice, quiet, easy evening. Don't get me wrong, nothing wrong with that if that is the life you have, but the sad thing is this mentality has carried over into the church and the minis-

try. Oh, yes, we want to do something for the Lord as long as it is easy and glamorous. However, Jesus said the Kingdom of Heaven needs Laborers.

The Wikipedia definition of a Laborer is "unskilled manual labor - physical work - Laborers are workers who many times will experience injury while on the job. They may become injured or killed and often times work in harsh conditions." Oftentimes Laborers are given the jobs that nobody else will do. They are not pleasant jobs, but they are jobs that must be done. Sounds good doesn't it? Who wants to do the job that nobody else wants? Who wants to get injured or hurt? Who wants to be doing something that gets little or no praise? I don't think many would willfully sign up for that, but Jesus said this is what I am looking for. Somebody to labor. He was simply saying "the Kingdom of Heaven needs somebody that will work."

I believe if Christ was in our church today, in physical form, He would still be presenting this prayer request and asking the members, "Where are the laborers?" My heart is burdened because there is a generation that doesn't have the determination to labor in the spiritual harvest fields. They will preach, they will sing, they will pastor a church as long as everything is going good, but when the Devil rises up to hinder and discourage, instead of laboring through (through prayer and perseverance), often the words, "The Lord has told me it is time to move on," are uttered. There have been many times as we labored in Haiti I have wanted to say those words. I couldn't, because even though the going was getting tough and even though I was hoping the Lord was saying it was time to move on, I knew He wasn't. In all honesty He was simply saying, "Labor on." Now looking at the young people we have raised in our home and seeing their desire to labor and accomplish something for the kingdom of Heaven, I can honestly say I am glad I have labored on. When one is willing to labor and continues to labor when everything is going against you, there will be great results. So to the pastor and minister who is discouraged - be an answer to the Lord's Prayer Request

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FROM A PRISON TO A PALACE

Acts 16:25 - And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.

Many a time during a trial, we have drawn encouragement from the choice of these men to praise God in the middle of their captivity. We have seen their faith in God rise above the circumstance, their gratitude above the pain, and their praise above the imprisonment. You may say, "Well, that was in the Bible times. How could anyone do that now?" By firsthand experience, I can tell you of someone who did.

In a MRI room awaiting further news of her condition, a lady whom I knew very well chose to praise God in what seemed like prison walls to her. It was her testimony that God transformed those prison walls into a palace through praise. You can have the same testimony that my momma did. Are you willing to lift your eyes above the circumstance to the one who is holding your hand? Isaiah 41:13 says, *For I the LORD thy God will hold thy right hand, saying unto thee, Fear not; I will help thee.*

The reason our faith can arise even in the midst of such a desperate situation is knowing who our God is. He is the Creator of all things. (Gen. 1:1) He is Holy. (Rev. 4:8) He is Faithful (Hebrews 13:5). He is our Healer. (Ex. 15:26) He is our Joy. (Ps.16:11) He is our Hope. (Rom. 15:13) He is our Peace. (Phil. 4:7) He is our Help. (Ps. 46:1) He is our Rock. (Ps.18:2) He is our Refuge. (Ps. 46:1) Oh, brothers and sisters, He is EVERYTHING we need! When you really get a glimpse of who He is, you won't be able to stay in that prison of despair. The prison will be transformed into a palace through praise!

There was a song we used to sing a long time ago, "What he does not keep you from, He'll keep you through." God could have protected Paul and Silas from the beating and imprisonment, but could it have been that the Philippian Jailor wouldn't have been saved? We aren't told who of the prisoners were converted by their faith in God, but we do see that the prisoners heard them. What a testimony Paul and Silas were to this whole prison of what God can do in answer to prayer! So we see that our prison, whatever the situation is, can be transformed into a place of victory and purpose. Romans 8:28 still says, ***"All things work together for good to them that love God to them who are the called according to his purpose."*** When one totally embraces this truth, he will be able to praise even in the midnight of the situation for he realizes that God is working it for good. I encourage you, my dear brothers and sisters: take on this challenge to praise God for who He is and what He is going to do even in the midnight. For it's then that you will see your prison being transformed into a palace.

Ministry can be summed up in one word – “OTHERS”.

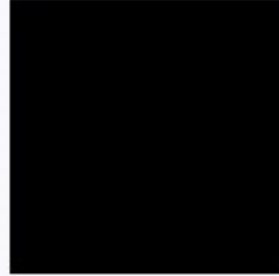
It's not about me and what I want; it's about God using me to be a blessing to others. Ministry is doing my part to help build the Kingdom of Heaven! When we begin to see “Ministry” as God sees it, we then realize that there are a lot of talents that can be used to minister that go beyond the platform.

God is looking for people who are not afraid to get their hands dirty and work for Him. I didn't really want to start naming things that you could get involved in because I didn't want to limit your thinking to those few things, but here goes - You could organize an outreach group, go out witnessing, help in a bus ministry, work with the children's church, do janitorial work at the church, volunteer anywhere and everywhere you can to help your pastor and his wife!

NOTE: One of the most important things to remember is that Personal Ministry is something that is built over time. You must be willing to take the low road and allow God to work through you and promote you. He will give you greater responsibilities as you grow in Him.

REMEMBER: When God begins to draw you into a deeper walk with Him, He will open doors for you to minister at a greater capacity/higher level. When you have proven trustworthy, He will place a burden upon you for a more specific position of Ministry. As that happens you will not be able to see yourself doing anything else; **you will not be truly happy living any other life than the life which He has called you to.**



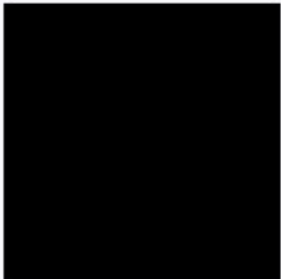
